



ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AND WASTE MANAGEMENT POLICY

Our environmental management policy aims to minimize the environmental impacts resulting from our activities by complying with environmental regulations and legal requirements, preventing air, water, soil, and noise pollution, and their negative effects on human health through proper waste separation. We ensure the sustainability of health, the environment, and natural life through the training we provide to our employees. To support this, we receive external environmental consulting services every month.

To minimize potential environmental impacts from our activities, we continuously strive to select and improve environmentally friendly equipment and systems. We aim to measure and enhance our performance in environmental management. In line with sustainable development goals, we work to conserve energy by reducing the use of resources such as electricity, water, and fuel, thereby minimizing waste and efficiently using natural resources. This helps us reduce the water and carbon footprints resulting from our activities.

To raise awareness about environmental sensitivity and water use, we place informational posters in various areas of our hotel. In guest rooms, we leave informational cards regarding the protection of nature and the environment, encouraging their contributions.

Waste management includes reducing waste at the source, separating it according to its type, collecting, storing, recovering, transporting, disposing of, and keeping records of disposal operations. Our Waste Management System's primary goal is to reduce waste volume, manage generated waste effectively to minimize environmental harm, and recover recyclable materials.

Under the zero waste project, we ensure the separation and proper disposal of waste. We provide training to our staff on the importance of waste separation. Our waste separation departments monitor this process. We place recycling and non-recycling waste bins in each department, continuously emphasizing the importance of waste management to our employees.

We provide sufficient waste bins throughout the facility to enable our guests to separate their waste. Hazardous waste is regularly collected in a hazardous waste storage area and delivered to a licensed waste transportation company. Instead of single-use breakfast products, we purchase bulk packaging products to reduce packaging waste.

We use refillable soap dispensers in common areas and staff restrooms. We aim to use single-use materials such as paper, napkins, toilet paper, and packaging only as needed to leave less waste in nature. We collect used cooking oils in a waste oil storage area for disposal.

To reduce paper consumption, we conduct our correspondence and announcements via email whenever possible.

In 2024, our primary goal is to take measures to reduce the amounts of generated organic, paper, plastic, glass, metal, medical waste, batteries, and hazardous waste, and to ensure the proper separation of these wastes for recycling under the zero waste project.
